

Power bills unpaid, dispensary shut for 2 yrs

As the traisant Dinapur gibn remarks not paid deside their yell of a bad deside rispensary at Johann without the page Balurghat block the power supplier has disponserted the dispensary's power connection. For the last two years, the people of the area are being deprived of the free treat ment made available at the dispensary.

dispensary There are nine villages There are nine villages served to this dispensary. As per the records of the dispensary, every day 60 to 80 patients used to come to the health centre. There is no other health centre of rearment facility available in this area. People of this area depended totally upon



this dispensary.
The Dakshin Dinajpur
Zilla Parishad has set up the
dispensary in the year 2006.
The health centre was supposed to provide free medical support to the residents of the area. Two doctors were also appointed at the dis-
