The aforesaid act of the driver may bring the case within the definition of murder viewed in the light of Clause 4 of Section 300 IPC which reads as follows:

"If the person committing the act knows that it is so imminently dangerous that it must, in all probability, cause death or such bodily injury as is likely to cause death, and commits such act without any excuse for incurring the risk of causing death or such injury as aforesaid".

The Commission is, therefore of the opinion, that an independent investigation by the Commission should be made for an impartial probe with special attention to the pieces of evidence which may point to culpability covered by Clause 4 quoted above.

ROAD RAGE: 7 FALL PREY TO KILLE

OUT OF CONTROL SPEEDING SCORPIO RAMS INTO GROUP OF STUDENTS NEAR RASHAKUNJ

Seven persons, six of them school students, died after they were hit by a speeding SUV near Rashakunja area within the limits of Bishnupur Police Station in South 24-Parganas district today, the police said.

A Thakurpukur-bound
SUV was coming from
Bankrahat at very high
speed and when it reached
the busy Rashakunja intersection it rammed into a
group of students, they said.
The accident took place
when the students of both
Rashakunja High School

Rashakunja High School for Boys and Girls came out of their respective cam-



puses after classes, police said. The driver of the SUV did not slow down even after seeing them on the narrow road. "Three girls died on the spot after they were flung into a roadside ditch from

the impact of the speeding SUV. Two boys, a girl and a woman succumbed to injuries at a local hospital. The students were all within the age group of 10 to 15 years. Six others who were injured in the accident were later taken to M R Pangur Hospital for treatment, Additional Superintendent of Police (West) Chandra Sekhor Bardhan said.

A private vehicle hit the

students and other persons in front of a school when the students were going back home at the end of their classes. The vehicle was ransacked and police resorted to lathi charge to disperse the mob. Some policemen were injured during a clash between the locals and the

police after the accident.

The students of Gyanadamoyee Vidyalaya of Rashakunja within Bishnupur police limits area were going home after their classes were over on Mon day afternoon. Some guardians also were then to receive their wards.
