Where police and civic police volunteers play extortionist

VALUE OF MANY

The police and the civic police volunteers allegedly behaved like extortionists and in two separate incidents leaving some lorry drivers and their helpers badly bruised. Local residents took the injured drivers and helpers to hospital. SP, Burdwan and senior police officials of Kalna sub division, however, remained tight-lipped about the incidents today.

The first incident was within Nadanghat police station limits in Kalna. A lorry laden with sand was stopped by the police at Naupara village crossing on charges of being overloaded. The vehicle had loaded the consignment at Panagarh and was heading into Kalna. The policemen, according to the local eyewitnesses and tine driver of the vehicle, first snatched the keys and demanded Bs 1,000 as spot fine. When the driver, Banshi Mondal, said he couldn't pay because he didn't have that much money, the police personnel became infuriated. They allegedly dragged Mon-

dal out of the cabin and beat him up. They, however, vanished from the scene when Mondal fainted.

The local people took Mondal to the Kalna Sub Divisional Hospital which referred him to the Burdwan Medical College and Hospital when his condition deteriorated due to multiple injuries at his head

and chest.
Close on the heels of the
Naupara incident came another
at Baidyapur. Two civic
volunteers of Kalna Police
Station were accused of attacking the driver and helper of a

lorry at Baidyapur crossing on STKK Road on the outskirts of Kaina town today. The lorry was carrying a consignment of stone to Burdwan from Assam. Claiming that it was overloaded, two young civic volunteers halted the vehicle and asked driver Prakash Yadav to get down from the cabin. Suspecting that the youths were not policemen but extortionists the driver hastily drove the vehicle farther away. This irked the civic volunteers and they forcibly dragged Yadav out of the cabin and beat him up with batons.

His helper, Sukhen Mahato, was also thrashed when he came to Yadav's rescue. Local people who wit-

Local people who witnessed the incident chased the
civic volunteers, who fled on
their motorbikes. The locals
then shifted the severely
injured driver and helper to
the Kalna S D Hospital and
made a complaint to the OC,
Kalna police station. Senior
police officials of the district
reserved comment on both
cases. Priyobrata Roy, SDPO,
Kalna and Rajnarayan Mukherjee, ASP (rural) also refused to
comment on the incidents.
